Some really sad news to share: Jenny Seymour, one of the original trainees and a long-term tenant of Apuldram, as well as being one of the founder members of the Chichester Gateway Club back in the early '80s - so I've known her for such a long time - has died.

Jenny was a fighter; she could be cantankerous at times: her speech wasn't always easy to follow and this frustrated her, but when you tuned in you discovered a wicked sense of humour and a fierce loyalty. Jenny loved Apuldram and chose to stay here through her illness; the Supported Living staff who supported her were outstanding in their professionalism and the care that they offered.

Jenny was a one-off and will be much missed.

Three years ago we published an article 'voiced' by Jenny through Julie Sandalls, who was particularly close to Jenny; as a celebration of Jenny's life, we've re-published it, below.
